The Venus Round System

The Tzolkin refers to the 260-day cycle which is roughly nine moons. The cycle consists of 20 day-signs combined with a number from one to thirteen. Each day is named by its number and day-sign, thus giving a total of 260 unique days. The day-signs are glyphs, and on one level are used in divination. Their meanings cover important themes in Indian culture and can be loosely translated as follows:


I.	Alligator	Death	Monkey	Owl
II.	Wind	Deer	Grass	Quake
III.	House	Rabbit	Reed	Knife
IV.	Lizard	Water	Jaguar	Rain
V	Serpent	Dog	Eagle	Flower
